### RECRUITING NEW MEMBERS



Create Place Cards for Holiday Dinner Seating. This fun activity will get even the younger writers excited


Thank You Notes. This is an important time of year to be thankful for all the gifts your child will receive. Make sure they write thank you notes to show their appreciation!





